Dr. Mrutyunjay Mohapatra is currently the Director General of Meteorology, India Meteorological Department since 1st August, 2019. He is the Permanent Representative of India with WMO with effect from 10th June, 2019. He has been elected as Member of Executive Council, WMO for the period 2019-23 with effect from 13th June. With a Ph. D in Physics and 27 years of experience in meteorology, he has made significant contributions in improvement of early warning services of IMD. He has brought laurels to the country from various international agencies like United Nations, World Meteorological Organisation for effective early warning, especially for cyclones. To mention a few are the timely and accurate warnings for cyclones, Phailin, Hudhud, Vardah, Titli, Sagar, Mekunu, Fani, Vayu, Hikaa, Bulbul and Amphan in recent years. His brilliance and expertise in cyclone warning has helped in better management of cyclones limiting loss of human lives to double digit not only in India but also in all the 13 WMO/ESCAP Panel member countries. He is popularly known as "The Cyclone Man of India". He is the author of more than 80 research papers published in peer reviewed national and international journals. He has edited 3 books and 7 Journals.
