Dr. Preetha Rajaraman, Health Attaché and South Asia Regional Representative for the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS), serves as a key advisor to the U.S. Secretary of Health and Human Services and the U.S. Embassy in India on matters involving health and biomedical research in South Asia. She is responsible for in-country representation, monitoring, and coordination of the policy, programs, and interests of all HHS agencies over a broad portfolio spanning research and innovation, non-communicable and communicable diseases, health safety and security, and health policy.
