Flow of the program:

Day 1:

Introductory Session: The program was started with the welcome of participants by Dr Diksha followed by inauguration of the program and a brief introduction on NABH Standards 5th Edition by Dr Nikita Sabherwal. A pre-test containing objective questions was taken to assess the baseline knowledge of the participants. Introduction of the faculties was given by Dr Diksha.

Session 2 & 3: Dr PN Kakar explained the chapters of AAC and COP. He explained each Standard and Objective Elements of each component with practical based examples. The difference between NABH Standards 4th Edition and 5th Edition were focused.

A small quiz was also conducted to interact with the participants and refresh the learnings. Questions were being addressed during and at the end of the session

Day 2:

The session began with the recap of the previous day's sessions taken by Dr Nikita Sabherwal. Post which Dr Nikita explained Patient's Rights and Education along with practical examples based on her experience.

Dr Kakar then took the session on HIC and MOM. He emphasized on the new practices introduced in the HIC and gave innovative examples of best practices. Q & A round was taken at the end.

Day 3:

The session began with the introduction of the new faculty Dr Sippy Malhotra, followed by a rapid-fire quiz to do a quick recap of the previous sessions by Dr Diksha. It was a good exercise with quite good responses. Followed by this, Dr Malhotra dealt with the chapters of PSQ, FMS and ROM. She used examples, exercises, videos, and case studies to explain the chapters in detail. Q & A round was taken at the end. Participants were given home exercise.

Day 4:

The session began with a quick recap of the previous day. Participants were randomly asked to answer to the exercise given previous day and a lot of participants had presented their views. The session was highly interactive. Dr Malhotra then explained the chapters on IMS and HRM. Video was displayed on Risk Identification and mock drill on Fire Safety. At the end of the program, all the sessions were summarized, and a quick recap was done. Dr Malhotra gave the concluding remarks.

All the participants shared their feedback on the MDP. Dr Sidharth Sekhar Mishra (Assistant Professor, IIHMR Delhi) gave the valedictory speech.

A post test was conducted after the workshop was over and feedback was also taken in the google format.


Total participants attended the program:


A total of 42 participants attended the workshop, in which 15 were external participants from varied hospital background and 27 were students of PGDHHM for the batch 2021-23 of IIHMR-Delhi.

Evaluation:

Total 39 participants completed the pre-test and 27 participants completed the post-test. The summary is as below:

Some of the positive responses received were –


- Learnt a lot from the experience of Faculties.

- Overall content and presentation was really good.


Some of the suggestions gave by the participants were –

- Being a student, it was an information overload in such a short span of time for me. I wasn't able to grasp all and to keep up with the phase all time. otherwise very informative session.






